### CALIFORNIA BOARD OF PODIATRIC MEDICINE June 7, 2019

### SUBJECT: ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM REPORT

ACTION: RECEIVE AND FILE STATUS REPORT

### RECOMMENDATION

Receive and file the status update report on Enforcement Unit activity.

### **ISSUE**

This status report highlights key areas and statistics for BPM's Enforcement Unit and other enforcement activity of note since reported at the last full meeting of the Board March 1, 2019, and covers the period from January 1, 2019 through March 31, 2019 for end of quarter purposes.

### DISCUSSION

### 1. Current Enforcement Statistics

Enforcement reports provide a "current capture" of quarterly data along with a comparison over the prior fiscal year's quarterly data (for the same quarter) in order to notate any statistically significant changes and better track improvements and/or deficiencies.

### A) Complaint Data

Third quarter complaint data over the prior year's third quarter data is provided for review. A total of 49 complaints were received between January 1, 2019 and March 31, 2019. This is a 53% increase compared to the same quarter one year ago when 32 complaints were received. The average days to close or assign a case are at 10 days for this quarter which meets the DCA target set. (Attachment A – Enforcement Statistics – Complaint Data).

### B) Investigation Data

During the third quarter, 44 desk investigations were assigned which is a 52% increase over last year, and 42 desk investigations were closed. Desk investigation processing time increased 29% compared to the third quarter of last fiscal year.

Seven investigations were assigned to the field during the third quarter which is a 40% increase over the third quarter of last year. Eight field investigations were completed with a 40% decrease in field investigation processing time over the third quarter of last fiscal year.

Case investigation times (which include both desk and field investigations) for the third quarter show the average days to complete investigations at 179 days, which is above the DCA target of 125 days. (Attachment B – Enforcement Statistics – Investigation Data).

### C) Disciplinary Data

Three disciplinary cases were initiated during the third quarter which is 40% below the same period last year when five cases were initiated. Two final Orders went into effect this quarter which is a 33% decrease over the same period last year when three Orders went into effect.

Two citations were issued this quarter compared to one citation issued during the same quarter last year.

One probationer successfully completed probation and another surrendered their license during the third quarter. There were eight active probationers at the end of quarter three. (Attachment C – Enforcement Data – Disciplinary Data).

### D) Enforcement Statistics – Fiscal Year (FY) to Date Totals

This report shows a summary of quarters one through three of FY 2018/2019. This period is compared to last FY 2017/2018 data.

Complaint initiation average days to close or assign has increased 43% from last year but is still within target.

Investigations assigned has increased 25% from the same period last year while the average days to complete investigations show a 25% improvement. Average days to complete investigations is at 142 days for quarters one through three. This is slightly above the DCA target set of 125 days.

Three final Orders have been processed so far this FY compared to seven final Orders processed in the first three quarters of last FY. There have been continued legal delays with the completion of a couple of cases.

Three citations were issued during the first three quarters which is a 50% decrease over last FY when six citations were issued. Citation violation descriptions have been added to the report. This information will be used in the future to show violation trends and to educate licenses in hopes to prevent future violations.

With enforcement cases, reports ran a day apart may show slight differences as the cases are always in movement with multiple parties working on them and adding activity codes. The reports provide an overall snapshot of the enforcement program at any given time. (Attachment D – Enforcement Statistics – Fiscal Year to Date Totals).

### E) Attorney General (AG) Case Aging Data

Case aging data based on reports received directly from the AG's Office is provided. The report includes information through April 23, 2019.

Three new cases were forwarded to the AG during the third quarter for the filing of an Accusation and one Accusation was filed. Two final Orders went into effect and there are currently 13 cases pending completion with the AG as of April 23, 2019. Three additional cases were forwarded to the AG in April and are technically not part of quarter three's activity but are included in this report. The pending cases also include two Non-Administrative Mandate cases. (Attachment E – Enforcement Statistics – Attorney General Case Aging Data). Staff is aware that some additional data is not received through the Attorney General reports, and this is notated below the table with references to the applicable cases.

The BreEZe system provides data for cases that have closed and the report from the AG report shows the aging for cases currently in process and recently closed. Case aging numbers with the AG are not going to match what is reported in BreEZe as AG start and end dates for receipt and closure of a case differ from DCA. DCA start dates begin with the date a complaint is intitated and close with the effective date of a decision (in most cases 30 days after it is signed). The AG start date is the date a case is accepted for prosecution and closes the date a decision is signed.

### F) DCA Performance Measures

DCA's new Open Data Initiative reporting tool has launched with enforcement data available for the 16/17 and 17/18 Fiscal Years: <u>https://www.dca.ca.gov/data/enforcement\_performance.shtml</u>

This tool allows individuals to search complaint, investigation, and disciplinary performance measure statistics and provides the data in a variety of charts and graphs. A search can be conducted by the quarter, or a full fiscal year of data can be viewed. Podiatric data can also be compared to the data of other boards and bureaus.

### 2. Probation Program Update

### A) Probation/Cost Recovery Recoupment

\$21,017.51 was collected in cost recovery and probation monitoring costs during the third quarter beginning January 1, 2019 and ending March 31, 2019. Quarter three cost receiveables averaged \$8,144.00 over the past five years. Collections for quarter three is above average this fiscal year. This is due to probation invoices going out late due to delays caused by the change of the state accounting system to Fi\$CAL. Therefore payments are being received later than usual.

### 3. Consultant and Expert Program Update

Preparations are being made to hold the annual Podiatric Consultant Training at the Western Foot and Ankle Confernce in Anaheim, CA on June 21, 2019.

Three of our 13 current consultants complete their 8 year terms on June 22, 2019. Two more are scheduled to term out March 19, 2020. The Board continues to have a need for additional consultants.

As of March 1, 2019, BPM expert witness pay was increased to a flat rate of \$150 per hour to be equal to what the Medical Board of California pays their experts.

### 4. Consultant and Expert Applications

Two podiatric medical consultant applications have been received and meet the qualifications per Board Policy. Their curriculum vitea's are presented for Board review, discussion and vote. (Attachment G – Consultant Applicants – Jack Bois, DPM and Parminder Jagur, DPM)

### NEXT STEPS

Staff will continue to review enforcement matrix reports and other data in order to effectively and efficiently expedite investigation of consumer complaints and prosecution of open cases. Staff will also research and provide suggestions for enforcement program improvements.

Case 8: Petition for Penalty Reduction withdrawn




