



#### INFORMATION ON CONTINUING MEDICAL EDUCATION

The Podiatric Medical Board of California (PMBC) strives to provide effective licensing and enforcement of Doctors of Podiatric Medicine as a means to protect the public from any unfit and incompetent doctors practicing in this highly specialized field.

# California Code of Regulations

Title 16 of the California Code of Regulations Section 1399.669 requires each Doctor of Podiatric Medicine to complete 50 hours of approved continuing education, including a minimum of 12 hours in subjects related to the lower extremity muscular skeletal system. *All courses must be scientific in content, and relate directly to patient care.* 

Licensees must maintain records of continuing education course attendance for a minimum of 4 years, in the event of an audit.

# **Acceptable Courses for Credit**

The following courses are approved for continuing medical education credit, provided they are scientific in content and relate directly to patient care:

- 1) Programs approved by the <u>California Podiatric Medical Association</u> or the <u>American Podiatric Medical Association</u> and their affiliated organizations
- Programs approved for Category 1 credit of the <u>American Medical Association</u>, the <u>California Medical Association</u>, or their affiliated organizations, and programs approved by the <u>American Osteopathic Association</u>, <u>Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons of California</u>, or their affiliated organizations;
- 3) Programs offered by approved colleges or schools of podiatric medicine, medicine, and osteopathic medicine;
- 4) Completion of an approved residency or fellowship program (credited for fifty hours of continuing medical education).

Any programs not qualifying under items 1-4 above may be approved by the PMBC following submission of an application for approval. Courses submitted for Board approval must meet several criteria including documentation that the course material is scientific in content and directly related to patient care. Courses in other subjects such as investments, tax planning, practice management, and risk management are not approved for credit.

Note: A maximum of one-third of continuing education hours may be satisfied by teaching courses offered by an approved continuing education provider.

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# **Waivers**

The Board may temporarily waive these requirements. A waiver may be granted <u>only</u> for reasons of health, military service, or undue hardship. A waiver must be submitted on an approved form provided by the Board.

Any licensee granted a temporary waiver may not be granted another temporary waiver at the next license renewal. (California Code of Regulations Section 1399.678(e))

## **Random Audit**

The PMBC annually audits a random sample of DPMs for compliance. Licensees selected for audit must provide documentation of compliance. Licensees are therefore required to maintain records of continuing education course attendance for a minimum of 4 years.
