NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF MODIFIED TEXT OF PROPOSED REGULATIONS CONCERNING Suspension, Revocation of Certificate to Practice

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Podiatric Medical Board of California (Board) has proposed modifications made to proposed regulation 16 CCR section 1399.659, Suspension, Revocation of Certificate to Practice Podiatric Medicine, and the revision of added 16 CCR sections 1399.659.1, Substantial Relationship Criteria, and 1399.656.2, Criteria for Rehabilitation. These regulations were originally noticed and filed with Office of Administrative Law (OAL) in November 2019, the subject of a public hearing on January 15, 2020.

Additional changes were made to the proposed text by the Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA) after receiving feedback from OAL and the modified language was incorporated into proposed regulations and the Board approved the modified text at the June 5, 2020 Board Meeting.
