TITLE 16. BOARD OF PODIATRIC MEDICINE

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the <u>Board of Podiatric Medicine (hereinafter "board")</u> is proposing to take the action described in the Informative Digest. Any person interested may present statements or arguments orally or in writing relevant to the action proposed at a hearing to be held at the State Capitol Building, Room 113, Sacramento, California, 95814, at 9:00 a.m., on June 1, 2007. Written comments must be received by the Board at its office not later than 5:00 p.m. on May 30, 2007, or must be received by the Board at the hearing. The Board, upon its own motion or at the instance of any interested party, may thereafter adopt the proposals substantially as described below or may modify such proposals if such modifications are sufficiently related to the original text. With the exception of technical or grammatical changes, the full text of any modified proposal will be available for 15 days prior to its adoption from the person designated in this Notice as contact person and will be mailed to those persons who submit written or oral testimony related to this proposal or who have requested notification of any changes to the proposal.

<u>Authority and Reference</u>: Pursuant to the authority vested by Sections 2470 of the Business and Professions Code; and to implement, interpret or make specific Sections 2480 and 2488 of the Business and Professions Code, the Board is considering changes to Division 13.9 of Title 16 of the California Code of Regulations as follows:

INFORMATIVE DIGEST/POLICY STATEMENT OVERVIEW

Business and Professions Code Sections 2470 authorizes the board to adopt, amend, or repeal, in accordance with the provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, regulations necessary to enable the board to carry into effect the provisions of law relating to the practice of podiatric medicine.

Amend Section 1399.696 Citations and Fines.

This amendment would increase the amount of the administrative fine in specified circumstances from a maximum of \$2,500 to \$5,000. This would amend section 1399.696 to conform to Section 125.9 as amended by legislation in 2003, chapter 788 (SB362.)

Amend Section 1399.697 Contest of Citations.

Change section 1399.697(b), which currently references subsection (e) of section 1399.696, to read subsection (f) of section 1399.696.
